This program is free of cost for Washtenaw County Residents; however, it is not tax funded, donations are encouraged to assist with disposal costs.

Accepted Materials at the Toxics Center are: Acids & bases, aerosol cans, asphalt/roofing tar, automotive fluids, batteries (automotive and household) cell phones, tablets, cleaners, polishes, cooking oil (liquid), fertilizers, fire extinguishers, fluorescent bulbs (compact/coil & tubes up to 4 ft.), gasoline/diesel, glues, kerosene, mercury, mothballs, motor oil, nail polish & remover, paints (latex, oil, & spray), pesticides, poisons, photography chemicals, pool chemicals, propane/butane tanks (up to 20 pounds), solvents, stains/varnishes, sharps (medical needles, in approved containers), smoke/CO detectors, wood preservatives. \*\*list subject to change.
